SUSTAINABLE BRIDGES: UNITE, UPLIFT, UPCYCLE

The third annual Western Balkans Circular Economy Week took place on 27-31 May, 2024. This year's theme was "Sustainable Bridges: Unite, Uplift, Upcycle".

Organizations from the Western Balkan countries, members of the LogEx community, held a series of parallel activities that aim to boost promotion of good practices and knowledge, but also the challenges and prospects of the circular economy in the region.

The regional initiative of the LogEx community – founded by The Balkan Forum – has the aim to revolutionize the Western Balkans' approach to sustainable development, by promoting circular economy practices. By bringing together different actors, including academia, civil society organizations, media, businesses and experts, we aim to foster cooperation and encourage meaningful changes in the region.
