Fast Forward





As part of "Engage, Connect, and Empower Youth for a Sustainable Green Future - Fast Forward," co-funded by the European Commission, a monitoring meeting was held by Project Officer Christelle Philips of EACEA. The session focused on reviewing key milestones, timelines, and work packages, allowing the project partners to assess both strengths and areas for improvement. This meeting confirmed the successful progress of the project, made possible through the joint efforts of our partners. Preparations are currently underway for the first Youth Exchange, set to take Sarajevo, place in Bosnia and Herzegovina.
