

CIRCULAR ECONOMY (CE) WEEK

SUSTAINABLE BRIDGES: UNITE, UPLIFT, UPCYCLE

The third annual Western Balkans Circular Economy Week took place on 27-31 May, 2024. This year's theme was **"Sustainable Bridges: Unite, Uplift, Upcycle"**.

Organizations from the Western Balkan countries, members of the LogEx community, held a series of parallel activities that aim to boost promotion of good practices and knowledge, but also the challenges and prospects of the circular economy in the region.

The regional initiative of the LogEx community – founded by The Balkan Forum – aims to revolutionize the Western Balkans' approach to sustainable development, by promoting circular economy practices. By bringing together different actors, including academia, civil society organizations, media, businesses and experts, we aim to foster cooperation and encourage meaningful changes in the region.

As part of the LogEx community, partner organizations in the Western Balkans organized key events during Circular Economy Week 2024. Build Green Group (BGG) in Albania hosted a webinar on May 28th in Valbona, focusing on waste management, and a session on May 30th with Cameron Price discussing the principles of the circular economy and innovative solutions. **COD Jajce** organized a workshop on May 28th to promote green entrepreneurship and the integration of circular economy practices into business. UNI-Universum International College held the Sustainable Fashion Festival, where students showcased designs made from recyclable materials and debated the role of the textile industry in Kosovo's regional economy. **<u>CIVIL</u>** hosted an online conference on May 31st, bringing together civil society organizations to discuss the perspectives of the circular economy in times of war and insecurity. **CENER21** organized a workshop for media professionals and students in Bosnia and Herzegovina, focusing on effectively communicating circular economy principles and environmental advocacy.



We were happy to welcome **Zero Waste Montenegro** to the LogEx Community in 2024! ZWM, dedicated to promoting sustainable waste management practices and advocating for a zero-waste lifestyle, brings valuable expertise and passion to our team. We look forward to collaborating with Zero Waste Montenegro on future initiatives and to the impactful contributions they will make towards advancing circular economy practices in the region. Their addition strengthens our shared mission of creating a more sustainable and circular future for the Western Balkans.





PROJECTS 1/4

ToKeQark

In 2024, The Balkan Forum successfully implemented the ToKeQark project across four municipalities in Kosovo– **Ferizaj, Fushë Kosova, Graçanica**, and **Mitrovica**. Focused on promoting environmental sustainability and climate change mitigation, the project highlighted the pivotal role of youth in driving community-led initiatives.

Key Achievements and Takeaways:

Youth Leadership in Action:

- Over 60 young people from diverse backgrounds and ethnicities participated in discussions addressing 21st-century environmental challenges.
- Participants received training on critical soft and green skills, empowering them as advocates for sustainability.

Community Engagement Activities:

- 21 interactive events included four <u>art installations</u> made from <u>recyclable materials</u>, four <u>public debates</u>, and four <u>awareness campaigns</u> promoting circular economy principles.
- Four <u>roundtable discussions</u> in each municipality established the informal ToKeQark network to foster collaboration among stakeholders.

Educational and Financial Support:

• Five students received green scholarships, enabling them to pursue initiatives in innovation, technology, green futures, and peace education.

Extensive Outreach:

- The project reached over 90,572 individuals through social media campaigns, televised debates, and community activities.
- Youth-led efforts were amplified via local public TV channels, sparking widespread community dialogue on environmental issues.


Community Impact:

- Youth groups worked alongside local stakeholders to promote recycling, climate awareness, and sustainable practices.
- The project fostered a culture of environmental responsibility while emphasizing the importance of the circular economy for a sustainable future.

Highlights:

ToKeQark not only empowered youth to take active roles in environmental protection but also created a platform for cross-community collaboration. By integrating innovative activities and leveraging media outreach, the project inspired a broader commitment to sustainability and positioned young people as catalysts for change.

PROJECTS 3/4

Fast Forward

Launched in March 2024, the Fast Forward project, led by Build Green Group and implemented by a consortium of five organizations across the Western Balkans and Spain, is fostering youth-led sustainability and environmental protection. Through youth exchanges, workshops, and training sessions, the initiative is equipping young people with the tools and skills to drive positive environmental change.

Key Achievements and Activities:

Collaborative Consortium:

- Partners include **Build Green Group** (Albania), Albanian Skills (Albania), BRAVO (Bosnia and Herzegovina), Eco-Logic (North Macedonia), The Balkan Forum (Kosovo), and Brigaid EU Project (Spain).
- A joint effort to promote regional cooperation and knowledge sharing for sustainability.

Training of Trainers (ToT):

- Two sessions held: one in <u>Valencia</u>, <u>Spain</u>, and another in <u>Vlora, Albania.</u>
- 60 participants trained in leadership, communication, and youth engagement strategies to champion sustainability efforts.

Youth Exchanges:

- Two exchanges in 2024: Sarajevo, Bosnia and Herzegovina, and Struga, North Macedonia.
- Each exchange brought together 30 youth participants to share experiences, learn skills, and discuss strategies for environmental action.
- A third exchange is planned for February 3-7, 2025 in Peja, Kosovo, with two additional exchanges to follow.

Skill Development and Empowerment:

- Training emphasized sessions leadership, communication, and sustainability-focused initiatives.
- More than 60 participants are now better equipped to lead programs and projects promoting green futures in their communities.



PROJECTS 4/4

Eco Champions

Initiated in 2024, the Eco Champions project tackles sustainable waste management within the framework of the EU Green Deal. The initiative promotes community engagement, democratic participation in environmental policymaking, and civic responsibility to inspire pride in sustainable practices at local and regional levels.

The project promotes democratic participation in policymaking and fosters civic responsibility, encouraging individuals to take pride in sustainable practices in their local and regional environments.

The project involves six partner organizations: **Connect** Your City and Bond Beter Leefmilieu (Belgium), Cohesion Network 2gether (Greece), The Balkan Forum (Kosovo), La Bien Paga (Spain), and Crhack Lab (Italy). These partners are working together to create spaces for community-driven action and dialogue. The official kickoff meeting for the project took place in December 2024 in Prishtina, Kosovo, marking the start of an active and engaged partnership. Eco Champions is supported by the European Union and is expected to implement core activities across Belgium, Spain, Italy, Greece, and Kosovo.



<u>Kickoff Meeting:</u>

- Organized by BF in December 2024 in Prishtina, Kosovo, with 26 participants from six countries (Belgium, Greece, Kosovo, Italy, Spain, and the Netherlands).
- Focused on aligning partner organizations with the project's vision and objectives.

Engaging Sessions:

- Panels and Discussions: Explored the needs and challenges in waste management and shared best practices in citizen engagement.
- Workshop: Facilitated the co-creation of innovative ideas for the Eco-Marathons.
- Presentations: Outlined the design and structure of cohesive the Eco-Marathons to ensure implementation.
- Strengthened • Networking: inter-organizational relationships and encouraged collaborative problemsolving.

Outcomes:

- Established a shared understanding among partners of the project's goals and their roles in achieving them.
- Laid the foundation for the Eco-Marathons, which will serve as a platform for community-driven action and

The Greenbridge project, launched in 2024, aims to foster regional collaboration on environmental sustainability by connecting youth from the Western Balkans through workshops and exchanges focused on green innovation. The first virtual meeting for the project was held in December 2024, and the official kickoff is scheduled to take place in Sofia, Bulgaria, in January 2025.



BERLIN PROCESS

Civil Society and Think Tank Forum 2024: A Key Gathering for Regional Cooperation

From October 9-11, 2024, The Balkan Forum joined 115 civil society representatives at the Civil Society and Think Tank Forum 2024, organized by the Aspen Institute and the South East Europe Institute. The event featured a series of impactful activities, including a conference opened by Dr. Anna Lührmann, Germany's Minister of State for Europe and Climate, with further contributions from Special Representative Manuel Sarrazin, Ambassador René Troccaz, and six ministers from the Western Balkans. One of the forum's highlights was a workshop titled "Enabling Spaces for Civil Society," which fostered high-level exchanges between decisionmakers and civil society representatives. Additionally, participants presented a comprehensive mapping study, "10 Years of the Berlin Process," to leaders of the Western Balkans, emphasizing the decade-long journey and progress made under the initiative. The 2024 Berlin Process Summit focused on key regional milestones, including the advancement of CEFTA agreements, the release of a new Common Regional Market Plan, and the establishment of a fifth regional mobility agreement. Further supporting regional cooperation, Kosovo announced the abolition of its visa regime for Bosnian and Herzegovinian citizens, effective January 1, 2025. This event provided a valuable platform for networking, where representatives could connect with like-minded individuals and explore new avenues for future collaboration.



INTERNATIONAL EVENTS

From October 21-23, Samir Beharić, Research Officer at The Balkan Forum, moderated a panel at the European Fund for the Balkans (EFB) conference on Bosnia and Herzegovina's stagnation. He discussed ongoing challenges with experts like Damir Kapidžić and Ivana Korajlić. On October 29-30, Samir attended a seminar in Skopje on youth work, presenting a study on youth brain drain and advocating for solutions to retain young talent in Eastern and South-East Europe.

Western Balkans at a Crossroads: A **Common Vision**

The Balkan Forum, in collaboration with the International Institute for Peace (IIP), Österreichisches Institut Für Internationale Politik (oiop), and the Karl-Renner Institut, hosted an impactful event in Vienna, bringing together young experts, activists, and stakeholders to address the pressing challenges facing the Western Balkans.

Workshops:

- Navigating identity conflicts for lasting stability.
- Citizen participation & democracy as tools for prosperity.

Public Debate: Is the EU still a transformative power in the Western Balkans?

The event facilitated rich discussions on strategies for unity, cooperation, and reform, with a strong emphasis on the role of youth in shaping the region's future.





THE BF PODCAST

The Balkan Forum proudly re-launched its podcast series, offering a fresh platform for in-depth discussions on important regional and global issues. The re-launch brings new episodes featuring a variety of topics, with experts, activists, and thought leaders sharing insights and perspectives on key challenges facing the Western Balkans and beyond. This renewed series aims to engage audiences in meaningful conversations that drive positive change and foster regional cooperation.



TOWARDS 2030 INITIATIVE

In 2024, **The Balkan Forum** launched the <u>"Towards 2030"</u> initiative, a platform designed to connect the Western Balkans to global conversations by featuring regional perspectives on pressing global issues. This initiative brought together writers from **Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo, Montenegro, North Macedonia,** and **Serbia** to share their unique insights on topics such as security, sustainability, democracy, human rights, innovation, climate change, and social progress. As part of this initiative, 26 blogs will be written, contributing to the broader regional dialogue. To date, 6 blogs have been published, providing valuable perspectives on the aforementioned themes. These blogs serve as an important tool for sharing knowledge and fostering understanding between the Western Balkans and the global community, while also highlighting the region's contributions to ongoing discussions on key global challenges.
